### Scholarship Information

As an additional benefit, after active participation for at least one year, any active NYSDB member is eligible for one of the scholarships that NYSDB awards each fall, contact the scholarship chair for more details. There are numerous scholarships for up to one week of blacksmithing instruction. Scholarships are available as funds allow so not all may be offered every year.

- The John C. Campbell Folk School in Brasstown, NC, provides us with a one week long tuition scholarship and the NYSDB covers up to \$500 to assist with materials, room and board.
- The NYSDB provides The John Rausch Scholarship specific for the Rochester Arc+Flame Center that covers up to \$500 to assist with tuition.
- The NYSDB provides up to \$1000 for a class to assist with materials, room, board and tuition.
- The NYSDB provides up to \$500 for a class to assist with materials, room, board, and tuition.

1:00 Iron in the Hat raffle


1:30 Possible Second demo of the day

## Hands On

We offer hands on practice time at every meeting for members. Unfortunately due to insurance concerns only members may participate but everyone is welcome to observe! Usually one of the first projects you will do is a hook. Wall hooks incorporate most of the fundamental black smithing skills you will need.



Hooks require you to: taper or draw down the stock; scroll or bend the stock; twisting is optional but fun; hot punch a hole for mounting; start to develop an eye for straightening.
